School report, July

1. Teacher Professional Development

All teachers participated in the workshop "How to Enhance Students' Self-directed Learning Ability through Effective Preview Strategies" on 6th July, which helped schools further promote and enhance students' self-directed learning ability.

2. Holistic Development of students

- a. The school arranged a visit to Noah's Ark Hong Kong in Ma Wan for P.5 students on 7th July. Students experienced the power of the great flood by visiting the museum and watching a 4D film. They also learned to protect the environment and cherish resources, rare and endangered animals.
- b. On 8th July, the Chinese Department held the "Read and Write Fun Day". Chinese teachers designed game booths based on the key content of the "Happy Read and Write" course. P.1 to P.3 students reviewed their daily language knowledge and learning strategies, so that students could enjoy learning Chinese in a fun way.
- c. On 14th July, a demonstration of trick rope skipping and a talk on heart health were arranged for students. Through the talk and a demonstration of rope skipping, students learned about the high-risk factors of heart disease and the prevention methods.
- d. The monthly awards ceremony was successfully held on 14th July. Awards and certificates were presented in a number of external academic and physical arts categories, including an essay writing competition, a Math Olympiad Competition, a Primary School Math Challenge, a Road Safety four-grid cartoon creation competition, a music competition, a Smart Sports STEM Competition, and an English drama competition. We hope that the students will continue to show their strengths and obtain good results.
- e. To enable students to learn more about urban design and urban development in Hong Kong, the school arranged for students to participate in the Planning Department's Outreach programme - Simulation of Urban Design from 18th to 19th July. Students extended their learning through exhibition panels, mobile education vehicles and workshops. P.3 and P.4 students used green materials in the workshop to design a livable and healthy city in groups. They communicated with planners and did their presentation.
- f. P.3 students visited the Hong Kong Zoological and Botanical Park on 19th July to learn about different species of plants and animals, such as conifers, hydrangea trees, ring tailed lemurs, Bornean orangutans, etc. Then they took the tram and the Star Ferry to experience Hong Kong's public transport while enjoying the views of Hong Kong Island. Learning is not limited to the classroom, while outdoor learning can improve students' interest in learning.
- g. On 21st July, our school celebrated the birthday of many students in recent months. Students were excited about the celebration. Teachers also took this opportunity to teach students to express their gratitude, be thankful for the parents and the teachers' love, care and guidance and cherish what they have.
- h. The school arranged a visit to the Hong Kong Space Museum for students in P.4 to P.5 students on 25th July. Students visited "Space Exhibition Hall" and "Space Exploration Exhibition Hall", and watched astronomy films in the "Space Hall". The students were interested to learn more about the mysterious science of astronomy with their peers.
- i. On 28th July, the English Department held an English Fun Day to let students at all levels experience the interest of learning English. The teachers arranged 12 game booths with different themes. The school hall was transformed into a learning playground. Students participated enthusiastically in the activities and had the opportunity to vote for their favourite booths.
- j. For four consecutive years, our school has won the "Care for School Award". "Care for School" Honorary School Award was jointly organised by the Hong Kong Christian Service and the Hong Kong Guidance Teachers Association and co-organised by the Hong Kong Education Bureau. The school has been providing students with quality education, actively promoting and practicing a caring culture, so that students can develop their potential in a loving and caring learning environment.

3. Home-school Cooperation

- a. On 9th July, the school guidance team held a parent-child day camp for the P.4 members and their parents of the "Understanding Adolescent Project". Through different activities, students and parents learned how to communicate and understand each other through workshops.
- b. On 26th July, the school organised a parent-child experience day for P.1 and P.2 students on Floorball and Floorcurling. Both students and their parents were involved in learning about these new sports and strengthened their parent-child relationship on that day.
